# Ministry of Jal Shakti hosts sarpanches for a special interaction, recognizing their role in building healthier, self-reliant villages



On 14<sup>th</sup> August 2025, just a day before India celebrated its 79<sup>th</sup> Independence Day, more than 150 sarpanches from across the country came together in New Delhi for a special interaction with the Union Minister of State for Railways and Jal Shakti, Shri V. Somanna.

The event, organised by the Ministry of Jal Shakti, aimed at celebrating grassroots leadership and acknowledging the critical role of village panchayats in advancing national programmes like the Swachh Bharat Mission (Grameen), Jal Jeevan Mission, and the Jal Shakti Abhiyan.

Speaking at the gathering, Shri V. Somanna called the sarpanches "true changemakers," applauding their leadership in bringing clean water, sanitation, and community development to rural households. He underlined the importance of their role in ensuring that flagship government missions translate into visible results on the ground.

Also present were Smt. Debashree Mukherjee, Secretary, Department of Water Resources and Ganga Rejuvenation, and Shri Ashok K. K. Meena, Secretary, Department of Drinking Water and Sanitation, who highlighted how local leaders are helping reduce groundwater stress, strengthen sanitation systems, and drive the next phase of development under Swachh Sujal Gaon and Har Ghar Jal.

Sarpanches from states such as Gujarat, Madhya Pradesh, Kerala, Uttar Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, and Andhra Pradesh presented innovative practices adopted in their villages from rainwater harvesting and waste management to community campaigns for hygiene and sanitation. These stories reflected the diversity of India's rural landscape and how each village is finding its own solutions while aligning with national goals.

The event also featured the screening of short films on Jal Jeevan Mission, Namami Gange, Swachh Bharat Mission (Grameen) and other key initiatives, offering a glimpse into the scale and impact of these programmes across the country.



## Har Ghar Tiranga – Har Ghar Swachhata: Linking Patriotism with Cleanliness and Sustainability



As the nation marked Independence Day 2025, the Har Ghar Tiranga campaign, led by the Ministry of Culture, inspired citizens to proudly display the tricolour and reaffirm their commitment to the nation. This year, the campaign was given a deeper meaning through the initiative Har Ghar Tiranga – Har Ghar Swachhata, coordinated by DDWS. The effort sought to link the pride of patriotism with the values of cleanliness, hygiene, safe water, and community action under SBM-G & JJM.

The integrated campaign encouraged citizens not only to honour the national flag but also to contribute to the upkeep of their surroundings including areas around water sources, and sanitation facilities.

The campaign was conducted in a phased manner with awareness commencing from 1 August and from 8–15 August, a series of activities ranging from community clean-up drives and WASH infrastructure beauti-

fication to Swachh Sujal Gaon pledges and awareness programmes were undertaken across the country.

## DDWS Supports MoHFW's Stop Diarrhoea Campaign 2025



The Ministry of Health & Family Welfare (MoHFW) led a nationwide initiative from June 20- to July 31, 2025, the Stop Diarrhoea Campaign . This campaign was aimed at achieving zero child deaths due to diarrhoea.

The campaign was supported by DDWS through their "Swachh Gaon, Shudh Jal - Behtar Kal" initiative. The campaign focused on promoting safe water and sanitation practices at the village and panchayat level aligning with the MoHFW's campaign goals.

#### DDWS's campaign focused on:

- · Promoting Water quality testing using Field Test Kits (FTKs) with results displayed in community spaces.
- · Encouraging rainwater harvesting and greywater management promotion
- Conducting drives/campaign for leakage detection and repairs to prevent

- · Special drives for Individual Household Latrines (IHHL) and Community Sanitary Complexes (CSC) construction and repair.
- Conducting sensitization workshops for local officials and communities.

#### **Nationwide Impact:**

- Over 2.75 lakhwater quality tests conducted across AWCs, schools and community centers.
- Over 11,000 training sessions for officials and community members.
- Over 32,000 IEC events and 27,000+ public awareness campaigns.

The Stop Diarrhoea Campaign 2025, led by MoHFW and supported by DDWS, demonstrated a successful convergence of health and sanitation efforts.



# UP's Raghunathpur's Journey Towards a Plastic-Free Future



In Sonbhadra district of Uttar Pradesh, Raghunathpur Gram Panchayat - Ghorawal block is setting an example of local leadership in action. Led by Gram Pradhan Shri Parmeshwar Pal, the Panchayat has launched a community-driven initiative to ensure the villages takes concrete steps towards becoming a plastic free village in future.

Every morning at 7:00 a.m., the Pradhan himself drives an e-rickshaw through the lanes of the village to collect plastic waste door-to-door. This act of leading by example has demonstrated how grassroots leadership can directly contribute to the national vision of Swachh Bharat and a Viksit Bharat.

Raghunathpur has 580 households with a population of about 2,500. The initiative began with community meetings, followed by distribution of collection sacks to households. Families gradually joined the effort by segregating and depositing their plastic waste directly into the e-rickshaw.

The collected plastic is taken to a Resource Recovery Centre where recyclable material is sold to scrap dealers, generating additional income for the Panchayat of over Rs 2,000 so far. Non-recyclable plastics are disposed of safely.

The journey so far, was not without difficulties. Some residents resisted initially, even discarding the collection sacks. However, with persistent dialogue and awareness campaigns, trust has been built. Today, villagers are active contributors to the campaign. Through the course of this effort:

- Over 200 kilograms of plastic waste has been collected to date.
- More than 300 households are actively segregating and responsibly disposing of plastic.



# 85 Village Sarpanchs from across India Invited as Special Guests to Attend Independence Day Celebrations at Red Fort

As India celebrated its 79<sup>th</sup> Independence Day, the Government of India invited 85 sarpanchs from 26 States and Union Territories to attend the historic Red Fort ceremony as special guests. This gesture honored grassroots leaders who have transformed rural governance by ensuring that their villages are declared ODF Plus under the Swachh Bharat Mission - Grameen and certified as 'Har Ghar Jal' under the Jal Jeevan Mission. Their presence reflected the power of community-led, women-led, and environmentally sustainable development.


Among the invitees were remarkable leaders who have turned their villages into models of progress. In Bihar, Prema Devi has led Motipur Gram Panchayat in pioneering the Gobardhan Yojana, where organic waste is converted into biogas and compost, improving livelihoods while reducing drudgery for women. Rajasthan's Kusum Singh has transformed Rarah into the state's first digitally enabled Gram Panchayat, with initiatives ranging from digital libraries and solar power to universal tap water supply and even a rural Astro Lab. In Gujarat, Shashikant Bhupendrabhai Patel has

integrated sanitation and safe water with inclusive innovations such as the state's first Braille-enabled community toilet, while also promoting gender equality through incentives for families of newborn girls. From Maharashtra, Deepali Uttam Chougule has ensured that every household in Nigve Dumala has access to toilets, while implementing a model system of waste segregation, composting, and recycling that has earned district-level accolades.

The recognition of these sarpanchs at the Red Fort is a tribute to their pioneering efforts in making villages healthier, cleaner, and more inclusive. Their work underlines how the vision of the Swachh Bharat and Jal Jeevan Missions is being realized at the grassroots. In the run-up to Independence Day, this spirit is also being carried forward through the 'Har Ghar Tiranga, Har Ghar Swachhata' campaign, led by the Department of Drinking Water and Sanitation in collaboration with the Ministry of Culture, which celebrates national pride alongside the promise of safe water and sanitation for every household.









### 4 Village Sarpanchs from Bihar Invited as Special Guests to **Attend Independence Day Celebrations at Red Fort**

As India marked its 79th Independence Day, four sarpanchs from Bihar were invited as special guests to witness the celebrations at the historic Red Fort in New Delhi. Their selection honoured Gram Panchayats that have been declared ODF Plus under the Swachh Bharat Mission-Grameen and certified 'Har Ghar Jal' under the Jal Jeevan Mission.

Among them was Prema Devi, Mukhiya of Motipur Gram Panchayat in Samastipur, whose leadership has made the village a pioneer in waste-to-energy through the Gobardhan Yojana, benefiting over 130 families and schools with biogas while also generating revenue through compost sales. Her initiatives in rainwater harvesting, soak pits, and greywater management have strengthened groundwater recharge, improved health, and reduced drudgery for women. She has received multiple national and state-level honours, including the Nanaji Deshmukh Rashtriya Gaurav Gramsabha Award and Climate Action Special Award.

She was joined by Kanhaiya Prasad Kushwaha of Siswania (West Champaran), who turned his Panchayat into a regional model with music-driven sanitation campaigns and a Swachhata Park for plastic waste management; Manoj Kumar Mandal of Raghopur (Bhagalpur), who mobilised Jeevika Didis and self-help groups for participatory Swachhata Chaupals and health drives; and Brajesh Kumar of Karsaghat (Gopalgani), who introduced the NADEP composting method to produce "Gopali Compost" while improving drainage and hygiene.

Their recognition at the Red Fort is a powerful testament to community-led rural transformation, where clean water, safe sanitation, and sustainability are driving progress.

### Suvidha - A Rural Sanitation Model That Has Stood the Test of Time



In the aspirational town of Rajam, in Vizianagaram district of Andhra Pradesh, a quiet but impactful sanitation initiative has been running successfully for more than two decades. Long before terms like "sustainable sanitation" became part of development vocabulary, GMR Varalakshmi Foundation (GMRVF), the CSR arm of GMR Group, launched an innovative community-oriented approach to rural public toilets. Known as Suvidha Toilet Complexes, these facilities combine affordability, community ownership, and efficient management ensuring they remain clean, functional, and relevant to local needs year after year.

The Suvidha Toilet Complex has been operational for over two decades and has significantly contributed to the objective of SBM-G.

# From One Toilet in 1998 to a Town-Wide Network

The first Suvidha public toilet was constructed in 1998. Over the years, the network expanded to 11 toilet complexes, eight in Rajam Municipality and three in surrounding villages serving both permanent res-

idents and transient visitors. Today, more than 2,000 people use these toilets daily. Central to the Suvidha model is a monthly family card system. For just ₹30 per month, a family can obtain a card allowing up to four members to use the toilets without extra cost. To meet the needs of the floating population, GMRVF also operates a payand-use toilet complex at the Rajam bus stand. This facility serves travellers, commuters, and market-goers-people who may not have a family card but still require clean, safe sanitation while in town. Revenue from family card fees and pay-anduse services is used for upkeep, cleaning supplies, utilities etc. Building on the success of Rajam's Suvidha model, GMRVF has extended its sanitation efforts to other locations.

Rajam's Suvidha Toilets demonstrate that rural sanitation infrastructure can be both community-friendly and running on chargeable basis. This model has been added under the LHI framework as a best practice, that has been operating successfully long before the LHI initiative was introduced—making it an early pioneer in sustainable sanitation solutions.




